Make it your own

Gather your supplies

- Printed kitty face template (link above)
- Laminator and laminating pouches
- Scissors and hole punch (adult use)
- Pipe cleaners and pony beads (older children)
- Paper strips and child-safe glue (toddlers)
- Book; mini cupcakes, frosting and sprinkles
- Toy kittens and a small cloth blanket

Make a kitten craft

- 1.** Print the kitty face. An adult laminates it and trims around the outside.
- 2.** An adult hole-punches the marked whisker holes on both cheeks.
- 3.** For older children, secure pipe cleaners through the holes and help thread the beads. For toddlers, glue on paper-strip whiskers instead.

Your afternoon plan

1. Make

2. Read

3. Snack

Decorate mini cupcakes with colorful sprinkles, then enjoy them together at the table.

4. Watch (optional)

Choose a cat-themed movie, such as *The Aristocats*, or skip ahead to playtime.

5. Play

Make a cozy little home on a cloth blanket and pretend-play with miniature kitten figurines. [Shop the play kittens on Amazon.](#)

For little hands: Adults handle laminating, cutting and hole punching. Keep tiny figurines and beads away from children under 3 or those who mouth toys. Follow the toy's age label. For toddlers, use large toy cats and paper whiskers.
